Late goal enabled S3 Dr. Moody to skate past S1 Dr. Alborzi 4-3

Mason Liaghat scored a rare natural hat trick (3 consecutive goals in the same period) but it was a goal by **Charles Hogg** that clinched the 4-3 win by Dr. Moody over Dr. Alborzi.

Travis Hamilton scored the game's first goal 1:45 into the contest as he broke through the defense and slid one through the 5-hole. Dr. Moody got the equalizer with 3:53 left in the first when Liaghat scored his first of 3 on a low forehand to the glove side. Two minutes later he gave Dr. Moody the lead with Liaghat low forehand from the left faceoff circle and he completed his natural hat trick :40 later low to the stick side from the right faceoff circle.

In the second period, Hogg extended the lead to 4-1 on a low glove side wrist shot, but Dr. Alborzi roared back, **Evan Alexander** got behind the defense and finished the play in style with a low glove side forehand from the right hash mark, assisted by Hamilton. The team made it a one-goal game when Hamilton scored on a low forehand past the stick side with :10 left in the second period, but Dr. Moody defense of **Brennan Higaki** and **Rowan Layne** stiffened, and forwards **Sydney Gallant** and **Alexander Stevens** were unable to score.

Eric Martin and **Tristyn Krieger** had some good looks in the scoreless third period but were turned aside by **Billy Kulda**, who played tough in front of goalie **Alex Sholl**. Sholl made 14 saves to earn the team's 3rd victory. Opposing goalies **Treythan Krieger** and **PJ Modena** combined to make 7 saves for Dr. Alborzi in defeat.

Dr. Maahs claimed the late game on the strength of 3 goals from S squirt scoring leader **William Outman** and a pair from **Ryan Hildebrand** to remain atop the S squirt division standings.

After a scoreless first period in which the defense of **PJ Modena** and **Eric Martin** held firm for Dr. Alborzi, Dr. Maahs got on the board 2:12 into the second when Outman corralled a **Jacob Poss** pass and forced in a forehand. He made it 2-0 with 1:07 left before halftime on a high forehand from the left faceoff circle.

The defense of **Annie Ginna** and **Aidan Bautista** was solid for two shutout periods in front of goalie **Weston Warren**, who made 15 saves on the day. In the third period, Hildebrand crashed the crease and converted a wristshot to make it 3-0, but Dr. Alborzi cut into the lead at the 7:11 mark when **Treythan Krieger** scored through the 5-hole off a pass from **Sydney Gallant**. Dr. Maahs built it back to 4-1 a minute later when Outman scored his third on a mid-glove forehand. Dr. Alborzi came back again, as **Travis Hamilton** took a Krieger pass and muscled home a high wrist.

Hildebrand rebounded his own shot to close out the scoring midway through the final frame, and **Eleanor Carpenter** and **Sequoyah Klingele** shut the door the rest of the way.

Evan Alexander made a handful of saves in the third period for Dr. Alborzi, with help from **Tristyn Krieger** and **Alexander Stevens** to keep **Robby Mitton** and **Annie Ginna** and **Moss Michelsen** from adding to the lead.

Late in the opening frame Louderback scored again as he collected a turnover in the offensive zone and shot it in by the near post. **Zane Hovermale** closed out the first-period scoring for Dr. Stasun with a high shot that rebounded right to him, and he converted for the 4-0 lead.

The team would add two more goals before Maguire Tree Care rallied. **Sean Baron** sent Louderback in on a breakaway to complete his hat trick, and **Liam Frank** lit the red light on a forehand after a scramble in front of the net.

Miller got Maguire Tree Care on the board with a wrist shot inside the far post, but Dr. Stasun wasn't done yet. Hovermale got his second on a forehand that trickled in off the goalie's skate, and **Joel Glasman** rebounded his own shot for the 8-1 lead.

Maguire Tree Care took over the game from that point, as Miller ignited a rally with his second 5-hole goal with just :18 left before the half. The team held the momentum as the third period started, as **Karsten Lansing** broke away and roofed a rolling puck. Miller lugged the rubber up the rink and lifted a forehand to cut it to 8-4 with 8:39 remaining. Just :48 later he got his fourth goal as he took a **Luke Outman** pass and wrapped home a rebound. He made it 8-6 only :29 later as he skated around the defense and bulged the back of the old onion sack with a forehand to make it a 2-goal game, and put him in a tie with Johnny Brozovich and Zane Hovermale atop the list of PeeWee goal scorers.

Keagan Maguire was turned aside on one scoring chance and **Jonhenry Poss** and **Cameron DeVry** tried to even the score, but the defense of **Indigo Kinzey** and **Antonio Roman** clamped down in front of goalie Glasman, who combined with **Michael George** to stop 24 shots for Dr. Stasun. **Ryan Tate** and **Anthony Sassi** were stopped in the final moments, and Kinzey added the final goal as time ticked down to secure the victory for the undefeated Dr. Stasun squad.

Shepherd atoned for his indiscretion by firing in a long, I mean a *really* long slapshot—like it was from a different zip code—to make it 2-1.

Noah Weinstein's wrist was deftly tipped by Olson over the goalie's shoulder 2:20 into the final frame to make it 3-1.

Lansing collected the puck and skated up the boards then cut toward the center on a 2-on-1 with Olson, who took the centering pass and put the biscuit in the basket for his second goal, and a 4-2 lead.

North Cossman had several scoring chances turned aside by **CJ Trexler**, until Capers scored his second of the game to help ice the contest as he put the puck past the prone goalie. Lansing slid home an empty-net goal for the 6-2 final. **Hunter Bishop** blocked 20 shots for Rocha & Son with defensive help from **Nate Rojo** and **Kiernan Gillooley**, but couldn't give Ocean Shore its first loss of the season.


DR. DAVID R. MAAHS

Bantam Division

Farbstein high wristed only 1:41 into the game set the tone for the high-scoring affair. WestShore Management Group tied it when **Rasmus Green** took a **Dante DiNapoli** pass and parked it in the goal from the right faceoff circle. The pair connected again just 1:11 later when Green worked to get open and netted another as he one-timed a centering pass from DiNapoli for the 2-1 lead. **Ethan Glasman** tied it as he converted passes from Farbstein and **Tom Martin**, and the teams skated into the first intermission at 2-2.

DiNapoli scored just :17 into the second stanza on a one-timer off a Green pass for the 3-2 lead, but the teams traded goals as Farbstein knotted it only :10 later on a high forehand.

With 2:06 remaining, WestShore Management grabbed a 4-3 lead when Green's rebound went right to DiNapoli, who was perfectly positioned for the put-back. DiNapoli got his hat trick with just :07 ticks left in the half on a long slapshot from the point.

Martin sent an outlet pass to Glasman, who played keep away from the WestShore Management defense and fed Farbstein for his third goal through the 5-hole to cut it to 5-4. **Johnny Kennedy** one-timed a nicely saucered pass from DiNapoli, who is tied for the lead in Bantam assists, to make it 6-4, but HMB Lions Club rallied.

Three minutes into the third Farbstein stole the puck and went high glove side, then tied the game :29 later on his league-leading 16th goal of the season as he found a seam in the WestShore Management defense and blasted home a high slapshot through traffic to knot the score.

With just :23 left in the third, **Morgan Hovermale** headmanned the puck to **Ben Bray**, who found an open Glasman, who put a slapshot under the goalie's glove for the 7-6 lead. Martin added a late insurance goal into the empty net, and HMB Lions Club won for the second time this season.

Goalie **Dexter Hamilton** was tested early and often, but made 22 saves on the day with help from **Zane Cordero** and **Graham Wylie**, who shut down WestShore when it counted. **Tristan Keller** got help from **Jacob Stevens** and **Griffen Dulay** in stopping a game-high 24 shots for WestShore Management, which fell to 2-2.
