

B2-HMB Lions Club edged B1-KHMB-FM-100.9/AM-1740 8-7 in OT

Pablo Jaramillo's breakaway goal 1:08 into overtime, his 4th score of the game, completed the comeback for HMB Lions Club in an exciting 8-7 overtime win over KHMB-FM-100.9/AM-1710. **Treythan Krieger** matched his pair of goals with 2 assists, and **Junuh Eblövi** made 13 saves for the victors.

Max Hunter opened the scoring for KHMB-FM 100.9/AM 1740 when he beat the goalie's blocker off an apple from **Patrick Hurley**. Team Teal extended the lead to 2-0 when Hunter took a **Johnny Brozovich** pass and lifted a backhand just over the goalie's waffleboard. One minute later Brozovich went top cheese to make it 3-0 and with 1:25 left in the 1st Brozovich notched his 2nd of 3 when he sent a searing snapshot over the goalie's shoulder.

With just :20 left in the period, HMB Lions Club finally penetrated the defense of **Taj Poloncheck** and **Cody deBeer** when Krieger pounced on a turnover and pushed in the plastic to send the teams to the locker room (or what passes for our locker rooms) at 4-1. **Tommy Kahle** was strong between the pipes early, ending with a game-high 14 saves.

Jaramillo recorded a natural hat trick in a span of just 2:08 to tie the score at 4-4, first on a forehand then on a spectacular move patented by Tomas Hertl, and then with a backhand deke that gave him the right to sing the "Dangle, Snipe and Celly" song.

KHMB-FM 100.9/AM 1740 reclaimed the lead on Brozovich's third, a hard forehand after a steal by Hunter. Krieger tied it for HMB Lions Club on a rising wrister but with just :20 left in the second stanza Brozovich left a drop pass for Hunter, who went high forehand to let KHMB-FM 100.9/AM 1740 skate into the break with a 6-5 lead.

Tristyn Krieger rattled home the rubber on a 3rd-chance rebound of a Jaramillo shot to knot the game at 6-6, and HMB Lions Club took a late lead when Treythan Krieger battled for a loose puck in the corner, and found an open **Jason Ricos**, who buried the 1-timer from the slot.

Evan Reeve tied it with 5:50 left by being perfectly positioned to cash in a rebound of a Hunter shot, and the defense of **Rocco Adragna** and **Nicholas Davis** stiffened, stifling any shot attempts on goalie **Junuh Eblövi**, who stopped 13 shots including some of the point-blank variety.

In bonus time, **Annie Ginna** was denied on a potential game-



Week 2 featured another pair of overtime Bantam games and end-to-end action despite searing weather on the Coast (you read that right).

P4-Dr. Moody beat P2-Goldworks 9-6

Ronin Halwani's hat trick led the way in a 9-6 win over Goldworks, keeping Dr. Moody undefeated. A pair of scores from **Cash Kopping** and a strong performance from guest goalie **Matteo Haro**, who made 13 saves, enabled Dr. Moody to overcome a 5-goal performance from **Max Dill**.

Liam Kehoe sprung Kopping for the first goal 4:49 in, and Halwani extended the lead to 2 when he went coast-to-coast, evaded the defense, and sniped home a shot past the goalie's glove. With 3:01 left in the first, Dill got on the board on a snap shot low to the glove side.

In the 2nd, the teams decided to skate 3-on-3 *a la* NHL-style overtime. Kopping used the open blue ice to his advantage, skating through traffic to score his 2nd to restore the 2-goal lead. Kehoe's low laser lifted the lead to 3. Dill cut it 4-2 on a forehand to the glove side, and delivered the goods after skating end to end after collecting a pass from **Lisbeth Shuffton** to slice the lead to 4-3 with 2:41 left in the 2nd. But 1:12 later Halwani roofed his 2nd to restore the 2-goal lead.

Goldworks applied the pressure in the 3rd, and some tic-tac-toe passing paid off when **Brady Baer** dug the puck out of the corner and sent it to a cutting **Chloe Wyman**, who found an open Dill for a wonderful one-timer, and Baer rallied the troops and tied the game with 8:28 left on a rising wrister. **Matthew Wylie** kept Goldworks in the game with 14 strong saves in the crease.

But Dr. Moody defender **Lukas Slusher** clamped down hard, and denied scoring chances by **Kai Higaki** and **Emil Al-Shaikh**,

and Halwani completed his hat trick on a sweet wraparound just inside the near post to retake the lead at 6-5. With Dill in the Sin Bin for Unsportsmanlike Conduct (what, tossing a stick like a javelin is illegal in hockey?), **Sophie Hunter** lugged the rubber up the rink, skated around the D on a breakaway, and scored a PPG.

The final minute saw plenty of late-game action. **Madelynn Haro** fed **Julie Nair** for a low forehand to extend the lead to 8-5 with just :49.7 left on the clock. With Halwani sent to Sin City for tripping with :39.6 left, it took Dill just :03 to take the faceoff and ripple the mesh on a hard forehand. And with just :02 left on the clock, Madelynn Haro broke behind the defense was able to find the twine on a high glove-side shot to make the final cushion 3 in favor of Dr. Moody.

B3-Jungletraders nipped B2-HMB Lions Club 8-7 in OT

Brandon Dong scored 4 times and Billy Ou's third goal :40 into overtime completed the comeback for Jungletraders in an 8-7 win over HMB Lions Club.

Pablo Jaramillo notched his 1st of 3 assists when he fed Jason Ricos, who went 5-hole to open the scoring for HMB Lions Club 1:18 into the game. Treythan Krieger was able to find the twine high glove side to extend the lead to 2 just :26 later. Eli Dill spotted a streaking Dong, who skated by the defense and sent one over the goalie's glove to make it 2-1. Jaramillo assisted on Krieger's 2nd, a low forehand just under the goalie's blocker, and Nicholas Davis sent an outlet pass to guest Max Dill, who slipped in a low forehand to make it 4-1 in favor of HMB Lions Club.

Dong then got his 2nd when he took an Aidan Zettler-Bray pass and rifled in a high forehand to cut it to 4-2, and with just :16 left in the first frame Alan Ou sauced one to Brennan Higaki, who lit the red light to make it 4-3 at the break.

Just :11 into the 2nd period, Zettler-Bray battled in the corner and fired the puck to Dong, who converted from the right faceoff circle to tie the game. Krieger reclaimed the lead for HMB Lions Club when he scored from an impossible angle off a pass from Jaramillo, but then the chemistry of Jungletraders took over. Zettler-Bray fed Billy Ou, who cashed in on a breakaway by going high glove-side to tie the game, and Billy Ou gave the team its first lead as he earned the week's "Mr. Bo-Dangles" title by stickhandling around the defense, deking the goalie, and sliding in the puck under the diving netminder.

HMB Lions Club tied the game when Ricos passed to Jaramillo, who scored on a now-you-see-it-now-you-don't backhand-forehand-backhand move, and the teams skated to the 2nd intermission at 6-6.

The offensive-zone rushes of HMB Lions Club forwards Tristyn Krieger and Mixie Nair were negated by Ethan Zettler-Bray as the defenses stepped up in the third, with only 2 goals added to the scoreboard. Junuh Eblovi made 5 saves for a total of 11 in the game, and Tommy Kahle made 7 of his 17 in the third. Eventually, after Rocco Adragna effectively cleared several pucks from the danger zone, Ricos dished to Jaramillo, who sent in a high wrist after skating around the D, but Jungletraders tied it at 7-7 when Billy Ou's centering pass set up Dong for a beautiful 1-timer slapshot, and the teams were ready for up to 3:00 of bonus hockey.

At the :40 mark of OT, Billy Ou lugged the rubber up the rink and went high glove side on a rising wrist to give Jungletraders its 2nd OT win of the season.

P3-Dr. Sheppard stopped P1-Premier Termite 8-5

Junuh Eblovi had a 1st-period hat trick and Aaron McCoy also scored 3 goals as Dr. Sheppard built a big early lead and rolled to an 8-5 win over Premier Termite despite being 1 skater short, when Finley Horner was placed on the Injured List with an upper-body injury.

Eblovi scored the first of his 3 goals on a low glove-side forehand after going coast-to-coast. His 2nd came on a low slapper, but Michael Slye got one back for Premier Termite when he slid home a forehand rebound into an empty net on a power-play with guest Cash Kopping in the penalty box for tripping. Eblovi restored the 2-goal lead on his 3rd of the day, but Dr. Sheppard was only halfway done in the period. Maximillian Levin didn't put the biscuit in the basket, he prevented center Emma Alexander from scoring, and played stout defense in front of Soren Brown, who stopped 11 shots.

McCoy scored twice in the remaining 3:21, the first coming on a low forehand. With Levi Terwey in the Sin Bin for tripping, Deaglan Eblovi broke away for a PPG to make it 5-3. McCoy then tickled the twine on a power-play goal of his own with Emma Vazquez visiting Sin City for (what she claimed was accidental) tripping, and the period ended 6-3 in favor of Dr. Sheppard.

Premier Termite stormed back in the 2nd period. Guest Max Dill dished off on a 2-on-1 with Trevor Barton, who 1-timed the puck to make it 6-4. Aiden Moore edged the team closer when he fired in a filthy forehand past the goalie's waffleboard. Slye sent a perfectly sauced pass to Dill, who scored from the left faceoff circle.

But in the 3rd, blueliner Paul Piper pinched up and denied Premier Termite forward Jake Curthoys, and Deaglan Eblovi made 12 3rd-period saves to prevent any further damage, as Dr. Sheppard pulled away. Junuh Eblovi found a streaking Olivia Keesor, whose forehand lit the lamp, and McCoy added more insurance when he turned and burned, skating in on a breakaway and sliding one through the 5-hole to make the final score 8-5 in favor of Dr. Sheppard.

S1-Raul Castillo Martial Arts topped S2-Real Estate Funding 9-3

Hat tricks from Zoe Wilson and Wyatt Ament enabled Raul Castillo to avenge its Opening Day loss, and grab a 9-3 win over Real Estate Funding Service.

Just 1:27 into the game, Ament scored from the slot, but Jeremy Raffai knotted the score on a clapper less than 2-minutes later. Raul Castillo reclaimed the lead when Madelynn Haro took the faceoff and fired a pass to Matteo Haro, who slapped one home. Matteo Haro rolled one in for his second goal, and Madelynn Haro shot from the slot to give Team Teal a 4-1 lead at the break.

She first took a feed from Holmes, fought off the defense, and fired home a forehand, then took another sauced pass from Holmes and went 5-hole. Ament notched his hat trick through traffic in front, and Wilson rattled home the rubber to close out the scoring.
